Greengrants is a 501(c)(3) public charity designed to bridge the gap between those who can offer financial support and grassroots groups in the developing world that can make effective use of that support. We help donors overcome the barriers to grassroots grantmaking by identifying great local organizations and moving funds at minimal cost.

Since 1993, we have made more than 1600 grants in 109 countries.

Since 2001, our revenue growth has averaged over 50 percent a year.

Greengrants support is designed to tap the energy and creativity of local groups and help them take the lead in protecting the environment. Local groups are usually in the best position to identify and address environmental problems, and although they almost always lack financial resources, they are a rich source of hope and energy and a powerful force for progress.

FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

In 2003, we passed the \$3 million mark in revenue – up from 2.4 million in 2002. Our administrative and fundraising costs dropped to 13 percent of expenditures in 2003, and this trend promises to continue, thanks to improved efficiency and economies of scale.

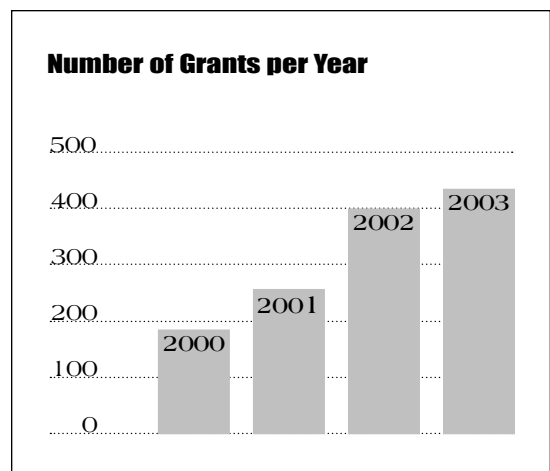
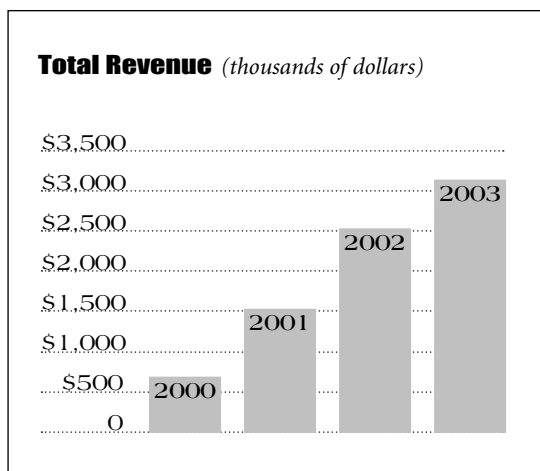
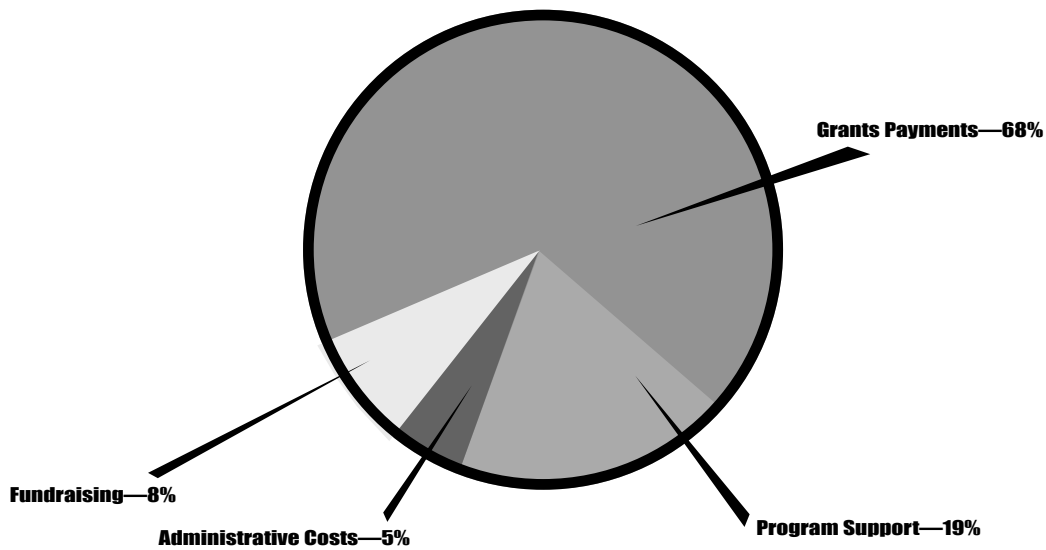
New donors helped us strengthen our financial position in 2003, and several, such as Ford Foundation and Open Society Institute, have the potential to increase their support as we develop long-term funding relationships. A new anonymous donor made a very generous gift of \$750,000. This gift helps jump-start our efforts to diversify our funding base to include a greater proportion of individual donors.

We made only modest additions to our advisor network in 2003, after several years of rapid expansion. This has allowed us to focus on improvements in efficiency and support of their efforts to identify prospective grantees. Our advisory boards now have the capacity to

increase grantmaking significantly as new donors come on board. For our near-term growth, we plan to make use of this grantmaking capacity before expanding our advisory board system significantly.

We are working with three of our advisory boards, Brazil, Mexico and Indonesia, to create independent grantmaking organizations, based on the Greengrants model. Together, we are determining legal and institutional arrangements to ensure their success and increase the financial resources available to grassroots organizations in these countries.

The chart below illustrates our 2003 expenditures. The majority of our expenditures (68 percent) were grant payments made to grassroots groups around the world. Program support includes the costs (such as travel and meetings) of supporting the work of our volunteer advisor network.
