## National Coalition on Mining

GHANA • Grantee

We're proud of all the Greengrants grantees that secured precedent-setting victories in 2009-10. The National Coalition on Mining had one such success story: they achieved a legislative ban on mining in Ghana's forest reserves. After a decade of organizing and advocacy, and the support of more than 20 small grants from Greengrants, the Coalition is a testament to the power of networks. It has expanded from four founding groups to include more than 30 community associations and national non-governmental organizations. These grassroots groups united their voices in opposition and changed the status quo.

## Small Change Fund

CANADA • Member, Greengrants Alliance of Funds

Our new ally to the north combines a Greengrants-style small grants approach with a new level of connectivity between donors and grantees. Small Change Fund incorporated in 2009 and launched [smallchange.org](http://smallchange.org), which features grassroots projects from across Canada.



Donors can use the website to choose organizations they'd like to give to, while activists can submit projects for funding. As an addition to the Greengrants Alliance of Funds, Small Change Fund connects our global movement to new resources and new ideas, with a focus on participation by all people at all levels.

## Mott Foundation

UNITED STATES • Donor



We've partnered with the Mott Foundation for eight years to develop new strategies for raising the voices of communities in international financing of infrastructure and energy projects. The Foundation's funding has expanded the strategic and geographic connections between our grantees working on similar issues throughout South America, Russia, Eastern Europe, and Central Asia.

Last year alone, Mott's generosity enabled dozens of communities to defend their rights and protect their land, water, and livelihoods from the impacts of large-scale projects. One such example is the Regional Public Organization Tolkyn, which opposes the proposed Katun Dam in the Altai Republic of southern Russia due to concerns about environmental damage and loss of communal land.

## Te Tika Mataiapo - Dorice Reid

COOK ISLANDS • Advisor

Global Greengrants Fund welcomed Te Tika to our Pacific Islands Board in 2009. As one of our 80+ volunteer advisors, she recommends grants to protect the unique cultures and natural resources of the Cook Islands. There, Te Tika also leads a council of tribal elders, as President of the Koutu Nui. She safeguards the environment, traditions, and welfare of her people, including reviving deteriorating lagoons to bring sustainable tourism to her region. Especially in rich biological and cultural regions like the Pacific Islands, everything is interconnected. This holistic understanding spurs grassroots action.

## Fishermen's Union of La Boca

CHILE • Grantee

Caring for local resources and traditions also requires grassroots leadership in times of catastrophe. In February 2010, an 8.8-magnitude earthquake struck the coast of Chile, and a subsequent tsunami pounded 600 kilometers of coast for hours. Thousands of artisanal fishermen lost everything—boats, docks, and their means to earn a living.

Greengrants grantee Fishermen's Union of La Boca responded immediately. They used an emergency \$5,000 grant to clean up the coastline and rebuild local fishermen's



livelihoods by providing basic necessities. From Indonesia to Samoa to Chile, our network of grantees and advisors connects in times of disaster to voice local needs and build resiliency to limit the impact of future disasters.

**Greengrants' Chilean Disaster Recovery Fund provided \$42,800 in emergency grants to help grassroots groups respond and rebuild after the 2010 Chilean earthquake.**

With the launch of the Greengrants Climate Fund in 2009, our network has prioritized innovative and inclusive solutions to the climate crisis. Our goal is to make 2,000 climate justice grants by 2015.

## Management Committee for Mocal Hydroelectric

HONDURAS • Grantee



While many of our grantees confronted high-level development projects and policies last year, many more pursued their own innovative solutions to environmental problems. In Honduras, the Management Committee for Mocal Hydroelectric used a \$3,000 grant to support community leadership in developing a small hydroelectric project on the Mocal River. The small dams will provide 12-15 megawatts of clean energy and a sustainable source of income for 20 nearby communities, without damaging the river ecosystem. This group and the hundreds of other grantees who are finding grassroots solutions to social and environmental problems are guiding the way to a more just and sustainable world.

## Wen Bo

CHINA • Advisor

Over the last ten years, Wen Bo has connected hundreds of environmentalists and grassroots groups as coordinator of Global Greengrants Fund's China Board. He has mentored a new generation of activists in the region, and he is ensuring the long-term stability of the environmental movement by building much-needed infrastructure. Many grassroots groups lack support for office rent and staff salary, so Wen Bo recommends grants to invest in the growth and idea-exchange of these newly established environmental organizations.



The Greengrants China Board recommended 15 small grants last year to sustain green resource centers across China. These offices serve as 'incubators' where environmental leaders can work and connect.

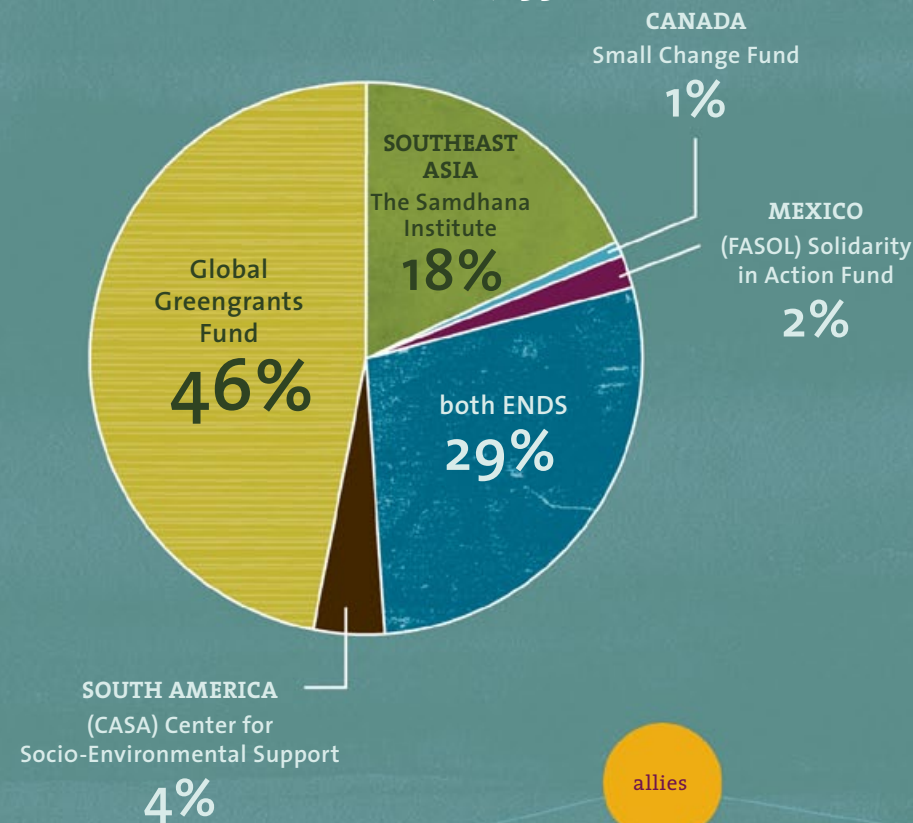
## Growing the Pie for the Grassroots
